The Great Barrier Reef has managed to escape being labelled "in danger" this week, but the Australian Government has been given a serious warning to step up its game on climate targets.

The Great Barrier Reef is a massive coral reef that lies off the northeast coast of Australia. It is bigger than the Great Wall of China, and it's the only living thing that's visible from space because, that's right, coral is alive!

Since 1981, The Great Barrier Reef has been a World Heritage Site, meaning that it is super special, not only to Aussies, but to everyone, all over the globe, and it should be cared for.

It's home to 400 types of colourful corals and 1,500 species of fish. Plus, it's where the endangered dugong (also known as a sea cow) and the large green sea turtle live.

But there's a problem. The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO for short) is like the global police for protecting wonders of the world - and it's been worried about the reef for a while. It says that soil and chemicals washing into the water, along with rising ocean temperatures, has caused coral bleaching. Coral

bleaching happens when the tiny algae living in the coral get stressed and start to die off, making the coral turn white. Recent tropical cyclones and hungry coral-eating starfish haven't helped either.

UNESCO has written the Aussie government a report card - which says it must to stick to and improve its climate targets to keep this spectacular reef safe for generations to come.
