Each day, we give the world globe a spin and find a news story from wherever it stops. Today, we've landed in Botswana, a country in South Central Africa, where an enormous discovery has just been made. A massive 2,492-carat diamond, the second largest ever found, has been uncovered! That's carat, c-a-r-a-t, not c-a-r-r-o-t. Carats are a unit of weight used to measure gemstones, and one carat is about the weight of a small paperclip. So, a 2,492-carat diamond is incredibly heavy and incredibly valuable! The average diamond engagement ring is about 1.5 carats ... so a diamond that's 2,492 carats .. that's a whole thing...

This dazzling gemstone was discovered at the famous Karowe Diamond Mine, known for finding record-breaking diamonds. But how do they find such big diamonds without breaking them?

The secret is X-ray vision. And you thought only superheroes had that, right? Wrong. A new technology, called XRT, scans the rocks for diamonds by detecting their unique density.

Imagine wearing one of the biggest diamonds found in the past hundred years! Fancy!

And Holly's catch cry? "Being a good person is more important than being a good athlete."
