The clean up is underway in Western Australia's Pilbara region today after Cyclone Zelia smashed into the coast at the weekend, forcing the evacuation of hundreds of locals.

The remote town of Marble Bar was worst hit, with rooves being ripped from some homes and flood waters completely submerging others as the Category 4 storm tore through.

Category 4 is the second most powerful cyclone you can have - with winds of up to 280 km/h.

Happily - as of yesterday, there had been no reports of anyone being seriously hurt.

Tropical cyclones in that part of Australia are not unusual - but the frequency with which they are happening - which is to say how regularly they seem to occur - and the intensity of them - which is to say how strong they are and how much damage they do, has experts pointing to climate change and a warming planet as partly to blame. Cyclones form when warm water out at sea is sucked up into the atmosphere. The warmer the water, the greater the likelihood of a destructive storm.

It follows of course the devastating floods that smashed Far North Queensland last week - where receding flood waters have left behind a red, muddy, mossie-infested mess. Eugh.

Meanwhile in Tasmania - firefighters are battling bushfires amid reports that it could also snow there. In summer. Because it's all a bit topsy turvy ..
