There's a risk of fake profiles, identity theft, privacy breaches—and possibly even legal trouble if your image is used the wrong way.

And that's got Squiz-E's scam sniffer twitching.

Remember, just because something looks cool or fun doesn't mean it's safe. Make sure to always check with a trusted adult before uploading any personal info or photos.
